






Below are the effects stolen information has had on people:

Emotionally

74% feeling stressed.

69% fear related to personal financial safety.

60% reported anxiety.

42% fearing for the financial security of family members.

8% reported feeling suicidal.

Physically

23% of ID theft victims feared for their physical safety.

39% experienced an inability to focus.

29% new physical illnesses such as body pain, sweating, heart and stomach issues.

41% had sleep issues.

10% couldn't go to work due to resulting physical issues.

Identity Theft Growth Rate:

In 2019, 14.4 Million consumers became victims of identity fraud.

33% of U.S adults have experienced identity theft, more than twice the global average.

New victims of identity theft every 2 seconds.

Consumers lost more than \$1.9 billion to identity theft and fraud in 2019

187.2 million online identites were stolen in 2011 for online fraud.
